Proverbs on Sluggardliness and Work

- **6:6-11** Go to the ant, you sluggard; consider its ways and be wise! 7It has no commander, no overseer or ruler, 8yet it stores its provisions in summer and gathers its food at harvest. 9How long will you lie there, you sluggard? When will you get up from your sleep? 10A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest—11and poverty will come on you like a thief and scarcity like an armed man.
- 10:26 As vinegar to the teeth and smoke to the eyes, so are sluggards to those who send them.
- 12:24 Diligent hands will rule, but laziness ends in forced labour.
- 12:11 Those who work their land will have abundant food, but those who chase fantasies have no sense.
- 12:27 The lazy do not roast any game, but the diligent feed on the riches of the hunt.
- 13:4 A sluggard's appetite is never filled, but the desires of the diligent are fully satisfied.
- 14:23 All hard work brings a profit, but mere talk leads only to poverty.
- 21:25-26 The craving of a sluggard will be the death of him, because his hands refuse to work. ²⁶All day long he craves for more, but the righteous give without sparing.
- 24:30-34 I went past the field of a sluggard, past the vineyard of someone who has no sense; ³¹thorns had come up everywhere, the ground was covered with weeds, and the stone wall was in ruins. ³²I applied my heart to what I observed and learned a lesson from what I saw: ³³A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest— ³⁴and poverty will come on you like a thief and scarcity like an armed man.
- 27:23-27 Be sure you know the condition of your flocks, give careful attention to your herds; ²⁴for riches do not endure forever, and a crown is not secure for all generations. ²⁵When the hay is removed and new growth appears and the grass from the hills is gathered in, ²⁶the lambs will provide you with clothing, and the goats with the price of a field. ²⁷You will have plenty of goats' milk to feed your family and to nourish your female servants.
- Matthew 11:28-30 Jesus said: ²⁸"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ²⁹Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."
