1. The futility of trusting in wealth (v7-12)

Psalm 49v7-9

- No one can redeem the life of another or give to God a ransom for them—
- ⁸ the ransom for a life is costly, no payment is ever enough—
- ⁹ so that they should live on forever and not see decay.

Their tombs will remain their houses forever, their dwellings for endless generations, though they had named lands after themselves.

For all can see that the wise die, that the foolish and the senseless also perish, leaving their wealth to others.

People, despite their wealth, do not endure; they are like the beasts that perish.

1 Timothy 6v17-19

17 Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. 18 Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. ¹⁹ In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life.

2. The wisdom of trusting in God (v13-20)

1 Peter 1v18-19

¹⁸ For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your ancestors, ¹⁹ but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect.

Psalm 49v16-19

- ¹⁶ Do not be overawed when others grow rich, when the splendour of their houses increases;
- ¹⁷ for they will take nothing with them when they die, their splendour will not descend with them.
- ¹⁸ Though while they live they count themselves blessed—and people praise you when you prosper—
- ¹⁹ they will join those who have gone before them, who will never again see the light of life.
