Abram believed the LORD, and he credited it to him as righteousness.

"believed" = to trust or rely on God

"credited" = to reckon something or credit something to someone else's account

"righteousness" = a right standing with God, meeting God's requirements

Abraham's question

But Abram said, "Sovereign LORD, how can I know that I will gain possession of it?"

#### Genesis 15v13-16

13 Then the LORD said to him, "Know for certain that for four hundred years your descendants will be strangers in a country not their own and that they will be enslaved and mistreated there. <sup>14</sup> But I will punish the nation they serve as slaves, and afterward they will come out with great possessions. 15 You, however, will go to your ancestors in peace and be buried at a good old age. 16 In the fourth generation your descendants will come back here, for the sin of the Amorites has not yet reached its full measure."

#### 2 Peter 3v9

The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead, he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.
