“In this world you will have trouble” (John 16v33)

2. An example of boldness (v8-22)

- Bold about Jesus (v8-12)

Acts 4v8-10

⁸ Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them: “Rulers and elders of the people! ⁹ If we are being called to account today for an act of kindness shown to a man who was lame and are being asked how he was healed, ¹⁰ then know this, you and all the people of Israel: It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified but whom God raised from the dead, that this man stands before you healed.

Psalm 118v22

The stone the builders rejected

Acts 4v12

Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved.

2. An example of boldness (v8-22)

- Bold about Jesus (v8-12)
- Bold before people (v13-22)

Acts 4v13

When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.


Acts 4v19-20

¹⁹ But Peter and John replied, “Which is right in God’s eyes: to listen to you, or to him? You be the judges! ²⁰ As for us, we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard.”

Two occasions when Christians must “obey God rather than men”

1. Where an authority *commands* something that God *forbids*
2. Where an authority *forbids* something that God *commands*

“If anything is needed in Christian witness today, it is boldness. We don’t need bigger music ministries, longer prayer walks, or nicer church foyers. We need boldness – wise boldness, gracious boldness, boldness rooted in the hope that we have in the gospel, boldness mixed with love, but boldness nonetheless.”





3. A prayer for (more) boldness (v23-31)

Acts 4v29

Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness.

“Why I am alive, I don’t know. But one thing I do know: until my time is up, and I know I will die one day – blood crash, air crash, car crash, whatever crash – until that day, I have a gospel to proclaim. I have a gospel worth living for, and I have a gospel worth dying for. What the enemy intended for harm, God has worked for good in our lives. The attacks and opposition have just made us stronger.”
