isaiah 49:8–23

Isaiah

1-39: the people in Isaiah's lifetime

40-66: the people in exile (and beyond)

Isaiah 40-55

40: put your hope in God, wait for him,
because he is going to come and redeem you

41-48: God will use Cyrus to bring you back to your land

49-55: God will send his Servant to bring you back to himself

Isaiah 49:8-23

v8-13: what the Servant will ultimately do
for those who put their hope in God

v14: the people's response

v15-23: the LORD's answer

What the Servant will do (v8-13)

- a new covenant (v8)
- a new exodus (v9)
- a compassionate Shepherd (v10-11)
- a global flock (v12)

BUT it doesn't always feel like that (v14)

But Zion said,
“The LORD has forsaken me,
the LORD has forgotten me.”

I'm so far beyond your
understanding.

Chapter 40

I'm so, so close to you
in love.

Chapter 49

I care and I cannot forget you (v15-16)

v15: more even than a mother

v16: engraved on his hands

- the metaphor
- the reality

Before the throne of God above
I have a strong and perfect plea:
A great High Priest whose name is Love,
Who ever lives and pleads for me.
My name is graven on his hands,
My name is written on his heart.
I know that while in Heav'n he stands
No tongue can bid me thence depart.

If you wait for me, I will not let you down (v17-23)

The hopeless mother, now surrounded by children

- the people of God corporately**
- each of us personally**

**“The LORD has forsaken me,
the LORD has forgotten me.”**

If you put your hope in me...

My cross says

I care and I cannot forget you.

My resurrection says

I will not let you down.

**“Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no
compassion on the child she has borne?**

Though she may forget,

I will not forget you!

See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands...

I am the LORD,

those who hope in me will not be disappointed.”
